Ag-CuO nanoparticles: biosynthesis by Staphylococcus aureus and Pseudomonas stutzeri bacteria and antibacterial properties

Abstract

The Ag-CuO nanoparticles were synthesized by using biological method. The biosynthesis was performed by using bacteria route. Aim of this study is synthesis and characterization of Ag-CuO nanoparticles and investigation of antibacterial properties. Structure, morphology and the optical properties of the synthesized particles were studied. The x-

ray diffraction (XRD) patterns of the Ag-CuO nanoparticles confirmed the produced materials. Electron microscopies studies showed the size of nanoparticles with homogeneous and uniform surface. Energy dispersive spectroscopy (EDS) confirmed the presence of Ag, Cu and O in the produce materials. Also, all samples were characterized by UV–Vis spectroscopies and the results were confirmed by XRD. Additionally, antibacterial property of nanoparticles in compound system was much better than single system.
